

BACKGROUND

- In 2022, the International Tennis Committee (ITC) –
 comprising representatives of all four National
 Associations discussed options to focus on more than
 just the everyday management of the sport's operational
 issues.
- The National Associations agreed it was important for them to consider and plan for the game and its future.
- The ITC acknowledges that, while the game is made up of c55 individual clubs along with four National Associations and the International Real Tennis Professionals Association (IRTPA), the ITC is best placed (along with other key stakeholders) to look at our game both globally and strategically, and to work with Associations on high level priorities for our game.
- Our goal is to firstly ensure we don't 'sleepwalk' towards a crisis and, secondly, to secure the future of the game by working together.

The opening of the new court at Westwood in Washington in November 2022 provided a starting point to begin these discussions.

- Player participation has consistently trended down in the past 10 years; the amount of play in clubs is directly linked to organised play, ie matches, tournaments, leagues.
- The average age of players has increased c.6 years in the past 12 years. It's now 49.4 (49.9 men, 45.8 women), and less than 20% of players are under 30 years of age (19.5%).
- The average handicap is 56.5 (54.6 for men, 71.0 for women).
- Women are only 12.3% of all players.
- Elite play is getting weaker. In 2008, 25 players were 'plus' handicaps; today, only c10-12 players are 'plus' handicaps. Only 2.9% of all players are better than handicap 20.
- Our game requires thriving clubs and successful professionals. As our pros retire, we will need roughly 35 new pros to come into the sport over the next 15 years. Is it an attractive career option for young people?
- Prize money globally has not kept pace with inflation over the last eight years, making travel and supporting tournaments more onerous on professionals.
- Finally, the game and our clubs need to ensure a sustainable supply of affordable rackets and balls to ensure access and secure the future of the sport.



- 2 Growing the game for the future.






AFTER THE CONFERENCE
